



How to make your own number cards.

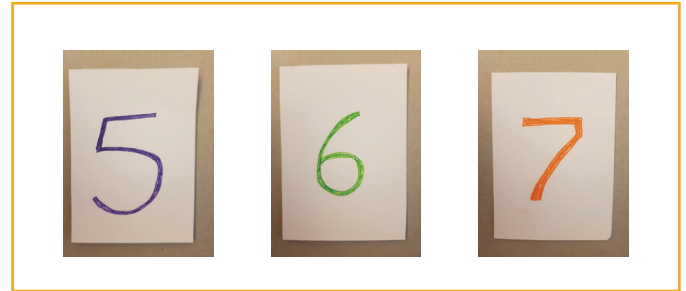
In Family Academy, ICM brings us materials to teach our kids. Some of those are available for you to print. But you can also make your own number cards to help your kids learn to count and identify things.

Step 1:

Get some index cards or cut pieces of card stock to a comfortable playing card size. I cut mine to 2.5in x 3.5in (7.5cm x 9cm).

Step 2:

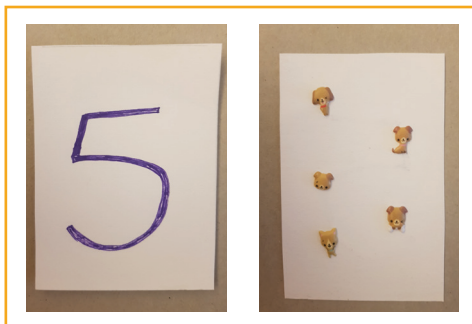
Write numbers 1 to 10 on the front of the cards. Your child will learn to write their numbers by tracing what you write, so do your best!



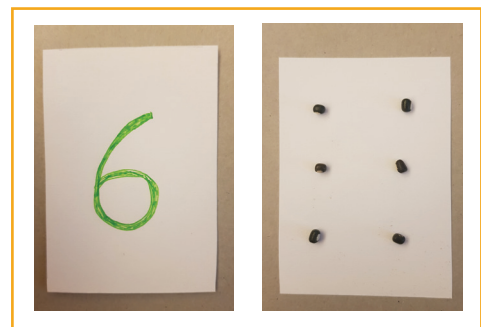
Step 3:

On the back of each card you will put symbols or objects that are the same to match the number on the front of the card.

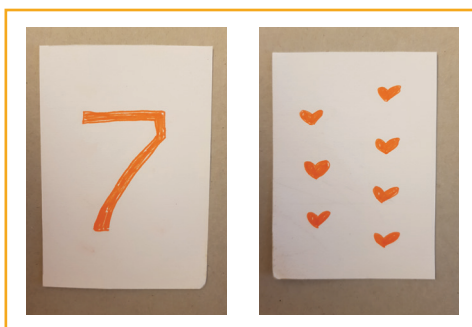
Here, I used 5 puppy stickers for my Number 5 card.



Here, I used 6 black lentils for my Number 6 card.

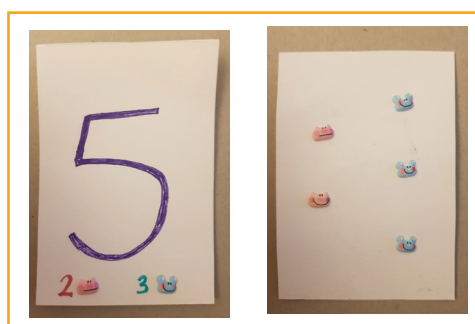


Here, I drew 7 hearts for my Number 7 card.



Step 4:

If you want to make extra cards for addition, you simply use different symbols to combine to the number on the front.



Here, I used two different kinds of stickers to show adding 2 and 3 equals 5.
